



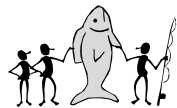

Jim Willis read several letters that the children had written thanking us for the Fishing Derby. If there was ever any question about doing another Derby, those letters made all the hard work with it.

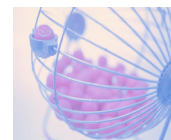

The Lion's Club Bingo Teams met for training and will open for the first Bingo Match on Saturday,

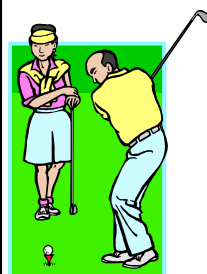
July 17th at 6pm. Basic card packs are 6 per page, 16 games for \$20. Cash prizes will be awarded. Tell your friends and come on down.
